

Taylor County Commissioners' Court

April 13, 2021

The Commissioners' Court of Taylor County met in Regular Session on April 13, 2021, with the following members present:

1. Judge Downing A. Bolls Jr., County Judge
2. Randy Williams, Commissioner, Precinct 1

When the following motions were heard:

1. Judge Bolls convened the Court in open session at 9:00 a.m. and announced the Court would conduct a public hearing on installing stop signs on CR 154 at intersection CR 154 and CR 127.

2. Commissioner Birchum made a motion to open the public hearing. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Williams and carried unanimously.

Commissioner Birchum reviewed the request and necessity for the speed limit signs. No member of the public wished to speak at the public hearing.
