TO PREPARE YOUR OWN OCCUPATIONAL DRIVER'S LICENSE YOU WILL NEED

1. A Petition for an Occupational Driver's License
2. Order Granting Occupational Driver's License
3. SR-22 Insurance form
4. Copy of you Driving Record from DPS online
5. Filing fee of \$350.00 (Non-Refundable) *Eff. 01/01/2022*

****Note-if your loss of a driver's license had to do with an alcohol related offence YOU MUST get an attorney to prepare & file your petition**

If you choose to prepare your own legal documents, please be aware that this office cannot tell you if you completed them legally correct. Documents to be filed in the Official Public Records will be recorded if they meet State of Texas recording requirements. All documents for the court or judicial process will be placed in the case file for the Judge's consideration
