
WHEREAS, the Taylor County Commissioners' Court finds it in the best interest of the citizens of Taylor County, Texas, to make application for and accept funding from the Texas State Comptroller's Office for the SB22 Rural Law Enforcement Grant for the Taylor County Sheriff's for FY2024 year; and

WHEREAS, the Taylor County Commissioners' Court agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the SB22 Rural Law Enforcement Grant funding from the Office of the Governor, Taylor County assures that the funds will be returned to the Governor's Office in full; and

WHEREAS, the Taylor County Commissioners' Court designates Taylor County Judge, Phil Crowley, or his designee, as the grantee Taylor County Sheriff's Office's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject alter, or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Taylor County Commissioners' Court approves submission of the grant application and accepts funding for the SB22 Rural Law Enforcement Grant for the Taylor County Sheriff's Office through the Texas State Comptroller's Office.




