### RESOLUTION 15-23/24


WHEREAS, the Taylor County Commissioners' Court finds it in the best interest of the citizens of Taylor County, Texas, to make application for and accept funding from the Texas State Comptroller's Office for the SB22 Rural Law Enforcement Prosecutor's Office Grant for the Taylor County Criminal District's Attorney's Office for FY2024 year; and

WHEREAS, the Taylor County Commissioners' Court agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the SB22 Rural Law Enforcement Grant funding from the Office of the Governor, Taylor County assures that the funds will be returned to the Governor's Office in full; and

WHEREAS, the Taylor County Commissioners' Court designates Taylor County Criminal District Attorney, Jim Hicks, or his designee, as the grantee Taylor County Criminal District Attorney's Office's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject alter, or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Taylor County Commissioners' Court approves submission of the grant application and accepts funding for the SB22 Rural Law Enforcement Grant for the Taylor County Criminal District Attorney's Office through the Texas State Comptroller's Office.




