WHEREAS, the Commissioner's Court of Taylor County agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Criminal Justice Division funds, the Court assures that the funds will be returned to the Criminal Justice Division in full.


WHEREAS, the Commissioner's Court of Taylor County designates Phil Crowley, County Judge or designee as the grantee's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

2024 INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT JAG GRANT

This Interlocal Agreement is made this the 16th day of October, 2024, between the City of Abilene ("the City") and Taylor County ("the County"), under the Texas Interlocal Cooperation Act.

WHEREAS, the Abilene Police Department and the Taylor County Sheriff's Office are jointly applying for the 2024 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG Grant) in an amount of \$39,448.00; and

WHEREAS, the City and the County agree it is in their best interest to equally split the 2024 JAG Grant if awarded;and

WHEREAS, this agreement is necessary to outline the term, rights, and duties of the parties as they relate to the acceptance and allocationof this grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City and County AGREE as follows:

Term of Agreement

This agreement shall begin on the date of last approval by the Abilene City Council and the Taylor County Commissioners Court, if required, and will continue for a period of four years or until the expiration of the grant, whichever occurs last.

Rights and Duties of the Parties

1. The City agrees to be the applicant and fiscal agent for the 2024 JAG funds grant and will pay the County a total of \$19,724.00, or 50%, of the allocated 2024 grant funds. The City will retain the remaining \$19,724.00, or 50%, of the allocated 2024 grant funds.
2. The City and County agree not to obligate or expend any grant funds until the grant is awarded by the US Department of Justice Office of Justice Programs and accepted by the City. In addition, any special conditions regarding when funds can be obligated must be met.
3. Any other payments made for the performance of governmental functions or services under this Agreement shall be made from current revenues available to the paying party.
4. Both the City and County agree to abide by all of the Special Conditions set forth in the Grant Award document which will be provided to the County upon receipt by the City and shall be considered part of this agreement for all purposes.
5. The County agrees it will allow periodic site visits by the City for the purpose of Programmatic Review to ensure grant compliance.
6. The Parties agree that the undersigned has been given the authority by the governing body to enter into this agreement.
7. The Parties agree that this document constitutes the entire agreement of the parties.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, THE CITY AND THE COUNTY have entered into this agreement.
